



Indigenous Heritage Month

Book Recommendations/Local History



The Valley area was known as Taeoga to local indigenous groups, including the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) nations. It had some significance as both the confluence of the Chemung and Susquehanna rivers and the intersection of well-used paths. Esther Montour, known today as "Queen Esther," had a settlement here that was destroyed in 1778 after the Battle of Wyoming. In 1779, Fort Sullivan was built on Tioga Point by General John Sullivan as part of the Sullivan-Clinton campaign, during which Sullivan and his men destroyed over 40 Haudenosaunee settlements.
